# THE LOSS OF A LEGACY

Unfortunately it wasn't an April Fool's joke when the Hillsburgh United Church was decommissioned on April 1st, ending a long history in the village.

From "Lennie Wade's Historic Glimpses of Picturesque Bear River": The first Methodist Church was built almost on the site of the present one, in 1837, and was used until 1859 or 1860 when the present one was erected. The old building was moved up to the Chute Rd, next to the home of H.H. Chute, where it still stands used as a dwelling home. Until 1860, this church belonged to the circuit of Annapolis, which was extended from Digby to Horton, but in that year it became an independent circuit and the ministers have been as follows: Rev. F.W. Pickles, R.Mason, J.S. Coffin, F. Harris, Wm. McCarty......

The church is now for sale for \$125,000: A Piece of History on the market.

## **BEAR RIVER BOARD OF TRADE NEWS:**

Don Rice and Pete Tomlin have been re-writing the by-laws of the Bear River Board of Trade. The Board of Trade was established in 1905, and monthly meetings have been held ever since. However, the new bylaws stipulate that general meetings will now only be held on a quarterly basis, that is, every 3 months. Since anyone wishing to join has to wait until the second meeting, it means that anyone not a member will have to wait 6 months to join. The other change to the by-laws is that the executive has the right to expel any member they feel is causing problems. No longer is there any due process of complaints and hearings.

Anyone with concerns about how this eliminates any pretense of the Board of Trade being a community organization should contact president Larry Knox. The Board of Trade is holding a Mardi Gras on the 4th and a plant sale at the Green Lantern on the 13th. If you want to help the Board of Trade pay off the thousands of dollars of debt from last year that they spent on surveyors and lawyers, here's your chance.
